Families in this community face many hardships including food







insecurity, health issues and a high illiteracy rate. Equipping women with the right tools, technology and access to finance can empower women to build a stronger more equitable economic foundation for their communities.

2020 Project Highlights

Women Farmers Project

RICE MILL - We were able to purchase a rice mill for the women farmers. This equipment decreases the labor for the women. Women typically spend more

than 2 hours a day threshing rice by hand. The rice mill is also being used by farmers from nearby villages for a small fee.

PORTABLE SOLAR LANTERNS: There is no electricity in the village. We provided each home in the community a portable solar lantern. These solar lights provide an easy and safe way to light homes.

PICS GRAIN STORAGE BAGS: These post-harvest storage bags are a simple and cost-effective way to store crops and seeds without chemicals. Using these bags improves food security and decreases post-harvest losses.



Upcoming projects:

FINANCIAL LITERACY INITIATIVE

The Pengai Village Financial Literacy Initiative will combine a VSLA (Village Savings and Loan Association) training with business development support. The program will improve livelihoods by increasing self-efficacy and building a strong foundation for creating new business opportunities.

CASSAVA PROCESSING EQUIPMENT

Cassava is a major crop for Pengai Women Farmers. It can be challenging to process the cassava by hand. This processing equipment will provide increased value to their cassava harvest.

SOLAR POWERED STORAGE FACILITY

The storage facility will reduce post-harvest losses and help to eliminate food insecurity in the village.
